International Students

Note: Registration must be completed at least 3 months prior to the requested course start date.

Required Documents

Please submit the following documentation to begin the registration process:

- Completed Enrollment Questionnaire
- Copy of your High School Diploma/GED/or college diploma/transcript¹
- Proof of English Language Proficiency (examples include TOEFL, high school or college level passing grades in English class)
- Copy of photo page of valid Passport with validity of at least 6 months beyond your period of stay
- Copy of Medical Certificate(s)²
- Evidence of Funds to demonstrate money is available to pay for your training and living expenses³
- Copy of the Wire Transfer Deposit Receipt⁴ (Wire Transfer Deposit covers the Academy student visa fee, student registration fee, initial deposit on your training account, and health insurance premiums).

Note: If your dependent family members will accompany you to the U.S., they will need to obtain F-2/M-2 visas. In order for Bristow Academy to produce their visa applications we will need the following documentation for each family member:

- Completed Enrollment Questionnaire (sections 1 and 2 only)
- Copy of photo page of valid Passport with validity for at least 6 months beyond your period of stay
- Adequate funds to cover health insurance premiums (amount to be included with Wire Transfer)

² For the Professional Pilot Program you will need a Class 2 Medical Certificate. In addition, you will need an EASA Class 1 Medical Certificate if you are registering for the EASA CPL(H) Integrated course or the Combined FAA/EASA Professional Pilot Program. [FAA approved doctors](#)

³ This can be in the form of a recent bank statement or a loan approval letter.

⁴ Wire transfer of USD \$3,000 (FAA program), or \$6,000 (EASA program), or \$9,000 (FAA/EASA combined program).

⁵ The Student Guidebook contains important information about Transportation Security Administration procedures that need to be followed. It is the Form I-20 "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant (F-1) Student" that you will take to the U.S. Embassy for your interview. Contact your local U.S. Embassy for appointments and additional application requirements.
